Part 1: Simplified Cost Options in practice in Interreg IPA Programmes – Future potentials for Interreg IPA Programmes

Simplification is increasingly important in implementing Cohesion policy as means to tackle administrative costs and burden - to improve the access to the funds and their good use by public authorities, enterprises, universities, civil society organisations in Europe. Simplified Cost Options (SCOs) and Financing Not Linked to Costs (FNLC) are one of these simplification measures introduced in the European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF). Key findings of the study "Simplified Cost Options in practice in Interreg IPA Programmes" conducted for the DG REGIO will be discussed. The workshop will highlight practical, replicable examples of SCO applications in Interreg-IPA programmes to provide food for thought for further SCO applications in territorial cooperation programmes.
