A NEW VISION OF TRANSPORT FOR DEVELOPMENT AND COHESION

The Trans-European Transport (TEN-T) core network contributes to providing sustainable and clean mobility solutions. Transport needs are rapidly evolving; digital transformation, environmental and social challenges require to upgrade projects and policies. ENERGY NETWORKS FOR DEVELOPMENT AND MARKET INTEGRATION

Well-interconnected and well-functioning energy markets are necessary preconditions for improving competitiveness, supply security and environmental sustainability. Instead, energy markets in the Macro-Region remain fragmented; integrating them into the wider European energy market will improve the resilience of the energy system and enhance economic and social development. Interconnecting the electricity grids, developing natural gas transmission-and-storage infrastructure, enabling for cross-border energy exchange, and establishing trading and auctioning platforms will improve the reliability and quality of energy services. SICILY, MALTA, TUNISIA: EXPERIENCE AND PROSPECTS OF MARITIME COOPERATION IN THE MEDITERRANEAN

Organised by the Department of Programming of the Sicilian Region (Managing Authority of Italy-Malta Interreg-VA and Italy-Tunisia ENI CBC 2014/2020 programmes), this Event aims to raise discussion among relevant regional partners on the future of European Territorial Cooperation in post-2020 Central Mediterranean area. RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

The purpose of the Workshop is to stimulate the debate on how to promote Research and Innovation (R&I) in the Adriatic-Ionian Macro-Region. Starting from an introduction on the European strategic framework, the Session will look into some existing initiatives and tools to support R&I investments at macro-regional level, focusing on the indicative actions defined in the EUSAIR Action Plan and on possible synergy between ESIF and direct thematic funds (e.g. H2020, COSME). Special attention will be devoted to Smart Specialisation Strategies (S3), a new approach that is key for the development and implementation of innovation strategies. Based on collaborative and participatory processes, S3 facilitate demand-driven innovation and collective solutions within quadruple-helix innovation ecosystems. Interregional cooperation based on S3 has the potential to connect innovation ecosystems, complementary skills, infrastructure and markets. Nevertheless, the challenge is to promote investment synergy between the private and public sectors and to build interregional competitive value chains. In a phase of transition between two programming periods, this Workshop will develop the following topics: (i) key role of Smart Specialisation in the future programming period; (ii) the importance of innovation ecosystems; (iii) how to reinforce innovation capacities and innovation ecosystems within “widening areas”; (iv) the role of networks as system integrators; (v) funding synergies and governance of the Macro-Region; (vi) concrete interregional cooperation initiatives and



pilot projects; (vii) possible strategic priorities to focus macro-regional R&I investments; (viii) how to involve the industry and SMEs in the implementation of Macro-regional Strategies; (ix) how to stimulate interregional innovation investments; (x) the role of EU financial instruments to enhance R&I in the Macro-Region.

TERRITORIAL POTENTIALS CONNECTED TO MIGRATION FLOWS

The Adriatic-Ionian Macro-Region faces substantial inflows of migrants and refugees from non-EU Countries. The Side Event is aimed at: (i) providing relevant territorial evidence to raise knowledge on the territorial impact of different migration and refugee flows in the Adriatic-Ionian and Danube macro-regions, whether national or regional, and in-transit; (ii) presenting an overview of the recent migration and refugee flows in the Adriatic-Ionian and Danube macro-regions. Capitalising on the dedicated ESPON 2020 Targeted Analysis, the Workshop will discuss the main driving forces affecting the geographical distribution of migrants, seeking to explain how migration affects the current socio-economic challenges while also offering opportunities; and (iii) discussing experiences of migrants' reception and integration policies with a specific focus on the activities undertaken by Interreg Programmes. In view of the post-2020 programming period, the Event will host a debate on how different territories can overcome the challenges of unpredictable and large-scale inflows, promote social inclusion, and enhance their capacity to cope with migration and refugee challenges and opportunities within their strategic policy and development objectives.

ECO-CONNECTIVITY

The Session draws on the importance of EUSAIR Environmental Quality priorities underlying the implemented activities, such as the presented AdrlonPAN Initiative in which efforts should be made to emphasise the importance of "eco-connectivity" and its implementation in future planning (ICZM and MSP) at national and regional level within the Adriatic-Ionian Region/EUSAIR.
