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The MRS EMBEDDING process

Is to align 2021-2027 national/regional EU funding programmes, the Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA), the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI) and also the centrally managed EU programmes with the relevant MRS priorities

Embedding Process at Programme level (Mainstream and Interreg Programmes)

Point (d)(v) of Article 22(3) CPR (Reg.(EU) 2021/1060)

2014-2020

- CPR (Article 96(3))
- ...an OP shall describe the integrated approach to territorial development,(..), specifying, where appropriate, the following:
- (d) the arrangements for interregional [and transnational] actions, within the OPs, with beneficiaries located in at least one other Member State (Section 4.4)
- (e) the contribution of the planned interventions under the programme to MRS/SBS strategies (Section 4.5)

2021-2027

- CPR Article 22 (3)
- > Each programme shall set out:
 - > (a) a summary of main challenges
 - (viii) MRS/SBS
 - (d) for each specific objective:
 - (i) related types of action + expected contribution to those SOs and to MRS/SBS, where appropriate
 - (vi) the interregional and transnational actions with beneficiaries located in at least one other Member State or outside the Union, where relevant
- **CPR Article 5 and 6**. Thematic Concentration 30% of ERDF and 37% CF to Climate Objectives



Embedding Process at Programme level (Mainstream and Interreg Programmes)

Specific objectives for the ERDF and the Cohesion Fund (Article 3(4) ERDF – Reg.(EU) 2021/1058): Two cross-cutting priorities

"With regard to the specific objectives set out in paragraph 1, the ERDF or the Cohesion Fund, as appropriate, may also support activities under the **Investment for jobs and growth goal**, where they either:

- (a) and (b) [capacity-building aspects]
- (c) enhance <u>cooperation</u> with partners both within and outside a given Member State.

Cooperation referred to in point (c) shall comprise cooperation

- with partners from cross-border regions,
- > from non-contiguous regions or
- > from regions located in the territory covered by a macro-regional or sea-basin strategy or
- a combination thereof."



ETC Reg.(EU) 2021/1059): related, important changes

Thematic concentration

- Interreg A, B and D At least 60% of ERDF for maximum 3 policy objectives, PO2 compulsory
- Interreg A on land borders At least 60% of ERDF for max 4 POs, PO2 and 4 compulsory
- Interreg A, B and D Up to 20% for "better Interreg governance" and 5% "a safer Europe"
- Interreg B 80% on Macro-Regional Strategy or seas-basin strategy
- Specifics for 4 programmes under Interreg C.



Cooperation within the area of a macroregional or sea-basin strategies

1. 4 EU Macro-regional strategies (MRS):

- Baltic Sea Region (2009) (8 MS + IS + NO)
- Danube Region (2010) (9 MS + BA + ME + RS + UA + MD)
- Adriatic and Ionian Region (2014) (4 MS + AL + BA + ME + MK + RS + SM)
- Alpine Region (2015) (5 MS + CH + FL)

2. 3 Sea-basin strategies (by DG MARE)

- Atlantic maritime Strategy (2011)
- Western Mediterranean (2017)
- Black Sea (2018)





The MRS Embedding process

- It allows a better use of the budget available for the implementation of macro-regional projects exploiting the economies of scale.
- Cohesion policy funds and IPA III programmes located in the Adriatic and Ionian region must ensure that they contribute to the actions and projects arising from the macro-regional strategies (e.g. EUSAIR Flagships).



The Embedding process at project level

- Joint projects: contributions to a single "pot" to fund a single project..
- Single project: Projects implemented in a single Member State contributing to the jointly agreed priorities of a macro-regional and/ or seabasin strategy
- Complementary projects: One programme funds one part and a second one another part.
- Coordinated projects: Separate nationally/ regionally implemented projects to achieve commonly agreed joint objectives ("cumulative effect") on the basis of coordinated and if possible synchronised decisions



How to boost the Embedding process at project level?

- Specific selection criteria (e.g. bonus points)
- Earmarking of a dedicated allocation
- Specific calls for cooperation projects
- Ex-ante or ex-post labelling (for communication)



Embedding – many untapped benefits

1. Benefits for the ERDF programmes:

- Sustainable Development of the macro-region or border area
- Bigger impact (more ambitious with tangible results projects)
- Good projects pipeline (better absorption)
- Visibility (political leadership, citizens, EU, etc.)
- Better links to policy-makers

2. Benefits for the macro-regions and border areas:

- Development of the macro-region or border area
- Experience from the programmes (knowledge of the issues)
- Contacts with policy-makers
- Funding




The Digital Assembly in Sofia, the European Commission was launching the Digital Agenda for the Western Balkans, in June 2018

Why are EUSAIR and Interreg IPA programmes needed in the region?

- 1. MRS are forms of territorial governance on a larger scale.
- 2. EUSAIR and the Interreg IPA programmes can play an important role in bringing stability and fostering EU integration, beyond contributing to growth and jobs in the Region.
- 3. Currently, the enlargement process has a vertical structure
 - Countries climb up from association agreements via the commission's "opinion" ("avis"), through candidate status and onto accession talks, until they reach the very last level: membership.
 - EUSAIR could promote a more gradual horizontal EU integration, strengthening the much-needed feeling of ownership of the process, of acceptance and equality.

Why are MRS and Interreg IPA programmes needed in the regions?

- More cost effective solutions:
 - Solving problems together instead of "re-inventing wheels" from country to country, region to region, etc
- 2. Territorial Governance is the formulation of public policies, programmes and projects for the development of a territory by:
 - Coordinating actions of actors and institutions
 - Integrating policy sectors
 - Mobilising stakeholders participation
 - Being adaptive to changing contexts
 - Realising place based/territorial specificities and impacts




Embedding – strategic success factors

Multilevel cooperation:

- Cohesion Funds (MS) MRS governing bodies, Managing Authorities, National Authorities
- IPA beneficiaries NIPAC, MRS Governing Bodies, EC (mainly REGIO, NEAR and EC Delegations in the region)
- At MS level, networks of Managing Authorities
 - European Council conclusions on the implementation of MRS (3-12-20) CALL on the establishment of networks of managing authorities to implement macroregional projects in the 2021-2027 programming period.



MRS Monitoring and Evaluation Important results from the EUSAIR Evaluation,



- Regarding the contribution on EUSAIR Topics in CP 2014-2020, the survey shows that the topics
 of Pillar 4 and those concerning terrestrial environment of Pillar 3 were included by most of the
 programmes, while Pillars 1 and 2 seem to have been supported by less programmes.
- The monitoring of relevant projects is highlighting the progress and the dynamics in sectors / thematic areas on topics of high importance but cannot express achievements and effects of the Strategy.
- The majority of ETC Programmes 2021-27 have selected the Interreg Specific Objective on better Cooperation Governance, while few programmes have selected the Policy Objective 5
- ESPON tool compatible with 4 MRS and the CSF data-basis
- Adjustment of Output, result, Impact and Governance indicators//ex-ante, ongoing,ex-post evaluation methodology for monitoring and evaluation systems in 4 MRS PP 2021-27



EUROPEAN INTEGRATION AND MRS E.C. Study on MRS to Cohesion Policy

- 1) Trade and Energy Integration
 (Trade relations between the countries of Macro-region, trade partnership with the rest of Europe)
- 2) Capital Integration (host countries to FDI and flows from other EU countries and outside EU)
- 3) Labour Integration (migration rate, flows, direction and percentages, migration organisations and networks in urban and rural areas)
- 4) Accessibility potential (by rail, motorways, air)

ECONOMIC COMPETITIVENESS

EU Regional Competitiveness index, Regional Innovation Scoreboard, EU digitalisation Index.

EDUCATION

Share of early school leavers and share of population having completed tertiary education, Education places

BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT

Business population growth, SMEs share of total value added

TRANSPORT

Completion of Trans-European Network, air, rail and ports infrastructure, Logistics and multimodal transportation hubs

In particular maritime transport (of goods, passengers, cruise ships, yachts, harmonization of port procedures) is macroregionally relevant

ENERGY

Renewable resources and eco-innovation, diversity of energy supply sources, dependence on fossil fuels and imports from inside and outside EU, energy vulnerability to crises.


TOURISM

Employment, Tourism contribution to GDP, number of UNESCO World heritage sites

ENVIRONMENT

Water Infrastructure, biodiversity, Natura 2000 and Ramsar areas, Sea Status and pollution, soil erosion rate, coastal, sea and inland waterbodies, green deal status, SEAs, prioritisation of sustainability over profitability, coastal and maritime spatial planning (fisheries, aquaculture, offshore wind parks, oil, gas activities, etc).

Developping Embedding Procedures, Tools and Projects

- I To match the 5 EU Cohecion Policy objectives to 11 ETC programmes
- II To match the 5 EU Cohecion Policy objectives to Pillars/Topics/flagships
- III To match the flagship Projects to eligibility for ECF/ERDF/CF/ CEF/ESF/EMFAF funds to National and Regional O.P. and EU LIFE/COSME/HORIZON and other Programmes.
- IV To set up regular COUNTRIES reports on embedding process, incorporating selection CRITERIA of the planned calls contributing to MRS and TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE actions associated with the implementation of MRS
- V To establish National Networks with regular meetings between TSGs and MAs and NC and regional and local representatives and International Networks per Pillar or Topic.
- VI To incorporate the MRS revision changes through the Programmes' content ongoing modifications
- VII To develop Platforms and Tools specialized to the needs of each MRS (Workshops, forums, web applications, Institutional Capacity and Networking Building Events, MRS Week, Annual Forum)
