

Objectives:


- To build capacity to design, implement and evaluate a new wave of innovation policies

We need blue skills & ocean literacy for (sustainable) blue growth

Blue skills

are needed to support the development of the blue economy



Blue economy

demonstrates the dynamism of the blue economy and the importance of the ocean for the economy and society

Ocean literacy

is essential to demonstrate the importance of the ocean and make careers in the blue economy more attractive



What is the EU doing?

- → Raise awareness about the ocean, its role and protection
- → **Reskilling** workers from other sectors, improve the **image** of blue careers
- → Developing ocean literacy and blue skills trainings across the EU
- → **Better cooperation** between education, government, science and bus

One of the flagship actions of the European Skills Agenda.


- > Aims to support public and private organisations with upskilling and reskilling, so they can thrive through the green and digital transitions.
