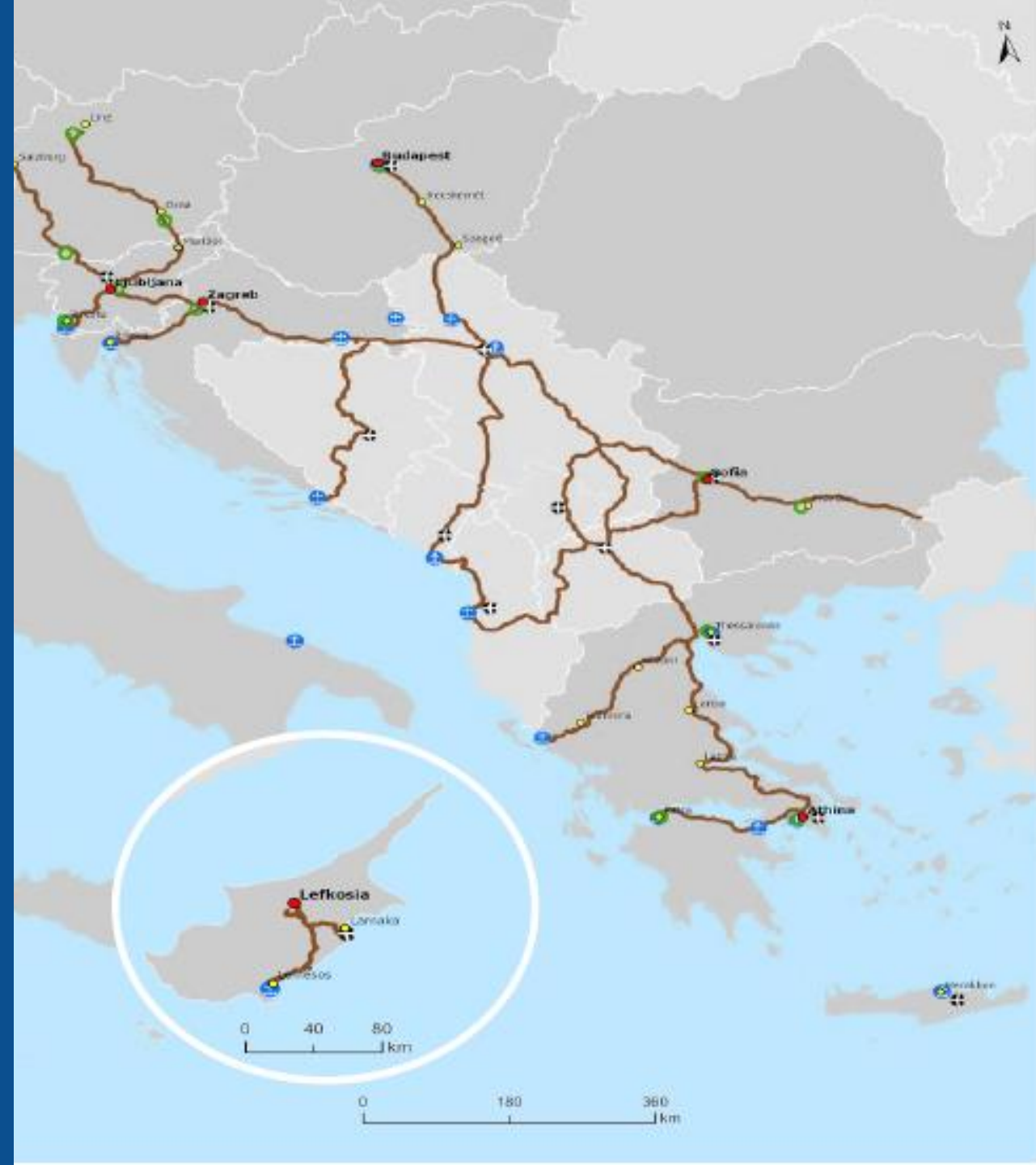

EU Core Corridors

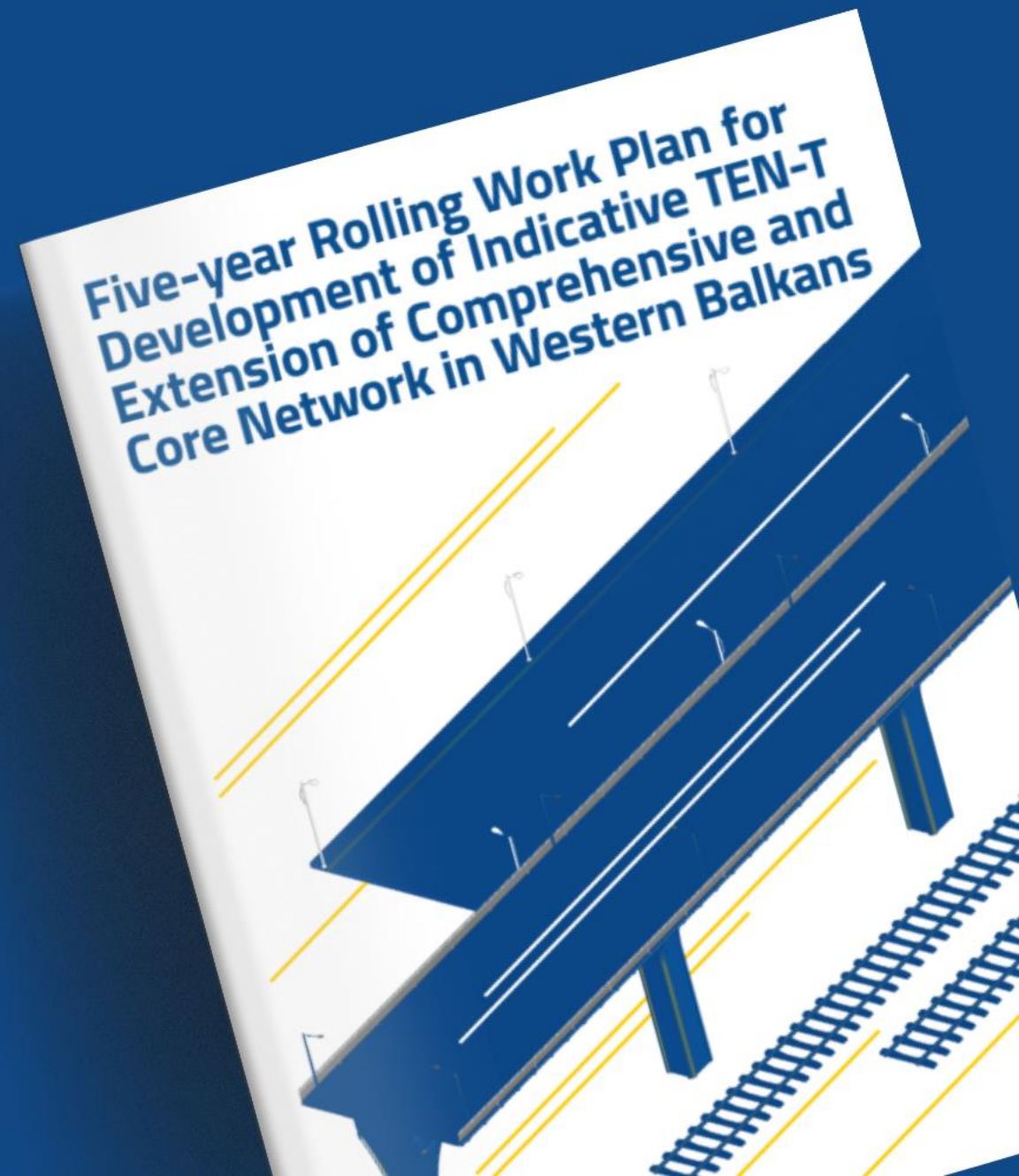
